### Current local policing priorities

COVID-19 | Under-25 Violence | Domestic Abuse

he West Bromwich Neighbourhood Team have been really busy over the last few months and have continued the partnership approach to tackling Crime and Antisocial behaviour in the Town Centre.

The recent Common Wealth Games has seen all the communities getting together and sharing in all the activities. With COVID19 finally behind us we have seen a significant increase in footfall within West Bromwich- and it's great to see this.

Unfortunately, a small minority of people who are visiting the town still behave in a manner which is not acceptable and the team are really keen to ensure that this is prevented. The current policing priorities for West Bromwich Town remain the same as previously - Under-25 Violence & Domestic Abuse. Recent work has resulted in two criminal behaviour order being granted by the court to males who have been causing issues in the town centre for a number of years - the conditions on these orders are stringent, they come with a power of arrest and the possibility of prison if the order is breached.

The team continue to be supported by the Guardian Police patrols and other departments including WMP Dogs who conduct patrols during key times in the town, during lunch times and the end of school and college. Again we have completed a number of stop and searches where appropriate and have identified and seized drugs and weapons.

overnors perform an important voluntary role within Education. Volunteering is a great way to contribute to your local community, meet new people and improve the lives of local children.

- Are you able to commit to a minimum of 3 meetings a year?
- Do you have an interest in education?
- Are you concerned about young people's development and school experience?
- Many organisations allow time out of work to allow for governance duties.
- In this current time most Governing Board meetings are held virtually.
- Personal Development opportunity

You must commit to training so that you can fulfil all the duties expected of a school governor - SIPS Education can provide this.

#### The Governing Board

As part of the governing board, you are responsible for making sure the school provides good quality education. Together with the head teacher, you set the school aims and policies.

- makes decisions on the school's budget and staffing
- makes sure the national curriculum is taught
- decides how the school can encourage pupils' spiritual, moral and cultural development
- · makes sure that the school provides for all its pupils, including those with additional needs.










he West Bromwich Urban Greening project has planned to deliver a number of initiatives over a 5-year programme, to enhance the existing greenspace and improve the appearance of West Bromwich Town Centre.
